

READY FOR CHANGE

Yes! But Winchester must vote for it says Steve Brine

The environment, Britain's economic crisis and the NHS were right at the top of the agenda for Winchester's Prospective Conservative MP at this year's Party Conference in Manchester.

Local family man Steve Brine spoke in the main health debate and made a passionate defence of Winchester's Royal Hampshire County Hospital. "I didn't move here to become the local MP", Steve told The Winchester Post. "This is my home and the place Susie and I want to bring up our family. Emily was born at the RHCH in 2007 and was at the front of my mind as I addressed conference on the importance of maternity services and A&E to the future of District General Hospitals."

As widely reported, George Osborne outlined specific measures to start tackling the country's damaging debt crisis. Steve says; "As I watched the Shadow Chancellor make clear, we are all in this together and we all have to deal with the legacy of this Government if we are to put Britain back on her feet.

"I was particularly pleased to see the focus on protecting vital public sector jobs in Winchester and Military personnel on active service overseas as well as details of our ambitious programme of apprenticeships to give young people locally real hope of sustainable long-term jobs for the future."



Steve Brine attended the Climate Clinic/Stop Climate Chaos reception and signed a pledge ahead of the crucial Copenhagen Summit in December 2009. He says; "This is an extremely important summit, we must ensure that a 'real deal' is done at Copenhagen.

An agreement can only be considered a success if it is capable of keeping warming below 2 degrees Celsius (the threshold for dangerous climate instability). The UK government should not be afraid to blow the whistle if a proposed deal will fall short of securing

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR BARTON FARM?

Cala Homes say they will submit an outline planning application for 2000 homes on the Andover Road site by the end of 2009 and recently held further public exhibitions in Winchester.

They involved the revised 'Masterplan' which "draws on the best qualities of Winchester's suburbs yet have a distinct character true to its time - fully integrated with surrounding neighbourhoods."

Prospective Winchester MP Steve Brine tells The Winchester Post; "I attended a briefing with Cala in October and it is clear to me they have done a lot of work and invested a lot of money in this revised plan. We now have the re-routed Andover Road and the 'Barton Farm High Street' proposal plus all sorts of hyperbole about Winchester deserving the "very best" from this new development. My view hasn't changed – Winchester does deserve the best and should not be hoodwinked by slick

presentation and piece-by-piece attempts to pacify objectors living near the site.

"None of this faces up to the simple fact that Winchester's infrastructure cannot cope with another 2000 houses on its doorstep. Cala can rush this all they like but a General Election is coming and if the Conservatives win we will put the Barton Farm decision back solely in the hands of elected Winchester representatives."

RESERVE SITES



Pitt Manor is a large site off the Romsey Road on the outskirts of Winchester.

Plans emerged recently for 200 homes on the site. Prospective MP Steve says; "This development would affect a large part of Winchester and we have to ask how much more this part of Winchester and its existing infrastructure can really take?"

Pitt Manor is known as a "Reserve Site" in the existing Local Plan as identified by the previous Liberal Democrat administration at Winchester City Council. It is triggered IF the area fails to meet housing targets but the (now Conservative controlled) Council recently made clear it will seek every legal means possible to protect sites such as Pitt Manor pending a possible change of Government next year.

LOCAL HOMES FOR LOCAL PEOPLE



Centrally imposed housing targets force us to embark on large unsustainable development to satisfy the Government – not local need.

Steve Brine says; "Our development policy is not anti-housing, far from it. We need new affordable homes for local people such as those in Bridgett's Lane, Martyr Worthy" (pictured).

The Prospective MP has discussed with Conservative leader David Cameron plans that will oversee the creation of new Local Housing Trusts for those communities that wish to develop new housing to benefit their area. "If elected next year, a Conservative Government

will believe in Winchester," Steve adds. "And we will relax the rules that prevent thousands of empty properties being used to help people on local authority waiting lists."

Speaking in the main health debate (pictured) he said small District General Hospitals, such as Winchester, were the bedrock of the NHS and called on the Shadow Health Secretary to protect maternity and A&E services in a future Conservative

He said; "David Cameron has pledged the NHS will be our number one priority in Government and it is my priority in Winchester.

"I told the conference that we have an excellent hospital with one of the lowest infection rates in Europe and rising patient numbers. But I also reminded the Shadow Health team that rising costs, from nationally negotiated pay awards to the impact of the EU's Working Time Directive, are pushing our local Trust into difficult times.

Steve made clear that although he accepts change and reform at the RHCH in coming years, the focus must always remain on services - not buildings or dogma - for the benefit of local people. He said his "red lines" for Winchester Hospital remained obstetric-led maternity as well as consultant-led A&E


