NEWS IN BRIEF

Supporting Children's Hospices

Conservative leader David Cameron has announced a new funding system to support children's hospices such as Sutton Scotney based Naomi House. The new per-patient funding stream for all hospices and other providers of end-of-life care ensures proper funding for essential home and community-based care for sick children can continue.

The party has also pledged to continue the £10million annual grant for children's hospices until the reforms become fully operational, so that there is no gap in funding.

Silver Hill scheme

Thornfield Properties, the Council's development partner in the city centre Silver Hill scheme, has been placed into administration.



Prospective Winchester MP Steve Brine said; "This is a huge blow but the fact remains this is an increasingly urgent regeneration project which the city needs to get underway without delay. To that end I hope councillors, of all colours, will now work together in the interests of Winchester to get Silver Hill back on track with a new partner, or partners, as soon as possible."

Central Housing Targets

Labour's centrally imposed regional housing targets will be abolished if the Conservatives win this year's General Election. Shadow Communities Minister Caroline Spelman MP confirmed she would do away with so-called 'regional spatial strategies' and allow Winchester City Council to re-write its Local Development Framework in the light of such a move.

The Prospective MP has recently met with residents living near the M3 South of Winchester (pictured) who are among those calling on the Highways Agency to act. "This has dragged on for years," Steve says. "My recent correspondence with the agency gives us good reason to put them on the spot and the issue back on the agenda. It's not about leaflets or websites collecting petitions, we know we have a problem right through the constituency with noise from the M3. I am therefore working with neighbouring MPs who have achieved success for their

constituents – such as Maria Miller in Basingstoke – to formulate a plan." Steve has also met recently with the Winchester Air Group which seeks better management of the air space north of Southampton Airport. He adds; "This couldn't be further from an anti-airport agenda but we want to see a 'noise action plan' which really works for Winchester residents. "If I am elected this year, I want to be able to hit the ground running on both of these important local issues."

SECURITY & DIGNITY IN OLD AGE

Steve Brine has told *The Winchester Post* he will always support older people locally who have worked hard throughout their lives and deserve security and dignity in old age.

The Prospective Conservative MP said personal experience meant he was determined, if elected this year, to support Conservative plans to help people in care keep their family home.

- Each year, around 45,000 elderly people are forced to sell their home to pay for residential care fees.
- Conservatives would give people the option of paying a one-off fee on retirement, in return for which all their fees would be waived – for life.



- People already over 65 would also be able to take advantage of the scheme.

NETWORK RAIL FREIGHT PROJECT

Hot on the heels of the major work at St Cross, Network Rail is preparing a three-month closure of Andover Road as part of a national programme to move heavy freight from road to rail.



The essential work is needed to raise bridges locally and accommodate new larger freight trains. St Cross Road remains closed until 31 March, after which Andover Road (at the bridge) will be closed from 12 April through 12 July. CARE IN THE AIR...

The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance began operations in July 2007 and has been proving its worth pretty much every day since.

The crew provide an efficient, rapid response to incidents across our area. The helicopter is called out on average 3 - 5 times per day, and many of these missions are life saving.

South Central Ambulance Service (SCAS) has been the focus of criticism after official figures showed response times compare poorly with other parts of the region and its boss confirmed he doesn't have enough vehicles.

There has also been unease locally after it emerged Winchester Ambulance Station is set to close with vehicles placed at standby locations instead.

Prospective Conservative MP Steve Brine has been contacted by concerned residents and staff. "Our worry is not only about rural cover but ambulance cover more generally. That is why I insisted the Chief Executive of SCAS comes to Westminster as a matter of urgency to meet myself and the Shadow Health Minister Mike Penning MP."

He adds; "It is far too simplistic to simply say we need more ambulances, that is a given. As always it is tied up with

budgets and misdirected Government policy putting the service under pressure. We need a Government that will tackle the four hour A&E target that has such a negative knock-on effect on ambulance cover, admit that pressure on A&E and the ambulance service exists because of changes to GP out-of-hours services and commit to protecting the NHS budget from any public sector cuts."

OUR PRIORITY-NHS

David Cameron has launched the Conservative Party's draft health manifesto.

Over three years ago the Conservative leader spelled out his priorities in three letters – NHS. Since then Mr Cameron, backed passionately by Prospective Winchester MP Steve Brine, has consistently fought to protect the values the NHS stands for and has campaigned to defend the NHS from Government cuts and reorganisations.

As the party of the NHS, we will never change the idea at the heart of our NHS – that healthcare in this country is free at the point of use and available to everyone based on need, not ability to pay. Labour promised to save the NHS but today, despite the massive increase in

I rely on the NHS like the vast majority of the people I seek to represent and will always back a strong District General Hospital in Winchester - with maternity and A&E."
